- We call upon all our key supplier to influence their global supply chains by improving transparency and accountability; and together we can help the government eradicate the injustice and brutality of modern slavery and human trafficking.
- All employees receive a copy of the Policy during their induction, and acknowledge in writing that they have done so. Updates are circulated to all employees upon re issue
